

## Week Seventeen

SLH Rayleigh went top of the Mixed Second Division with an 8-1 win away at bottom placed Hawkwell. Adam Whiting and Ashleigh Smith and Sarah Hall and Gavin Childs both won three perfect rubbers each and were supported by a brace from Peter Hall and Caroline Fletcher to make it four wins out of four this season. Andrew Strutt and Sophie Pearson picked up the one for the home side who are two points adrift at the bottom.

In the division above, Greensward triumphed by the same score against Fitzwimarc Seconds at home as they also went top. Tim Baskett and Tracey Haylett and Robert Dunn and Sara Thompson both won three rubbers each with Andrew McMahon and Mandie Breed winning a further two. Sam Cheung and Donna Vennables got the one for the visitors as five of the nine rubbers went to three.

There were two matches in the Men's Second Division which both finished 6-3 to the hosts. David Lloyd Seconds beat Fitzwimarc Fourths courtesy of Alex Cheung and John Hodges and Dan Allen and Jon Beaven picking up a hat-trick each but they couldn't field an eligible person in the third pair meaning Fitz picked up three points automatically.
